Quarterly State Personal Income

- BEA's regional "lead estimate".
- Released three months after referenced quarter.
- Only produced for States (and Washington DC).
- States are controlled to quarterly National (NIPA) growth rates.
- Less detail than annual estimates. Earnings estimated at NAICS sector level.
- Limited direct source data.

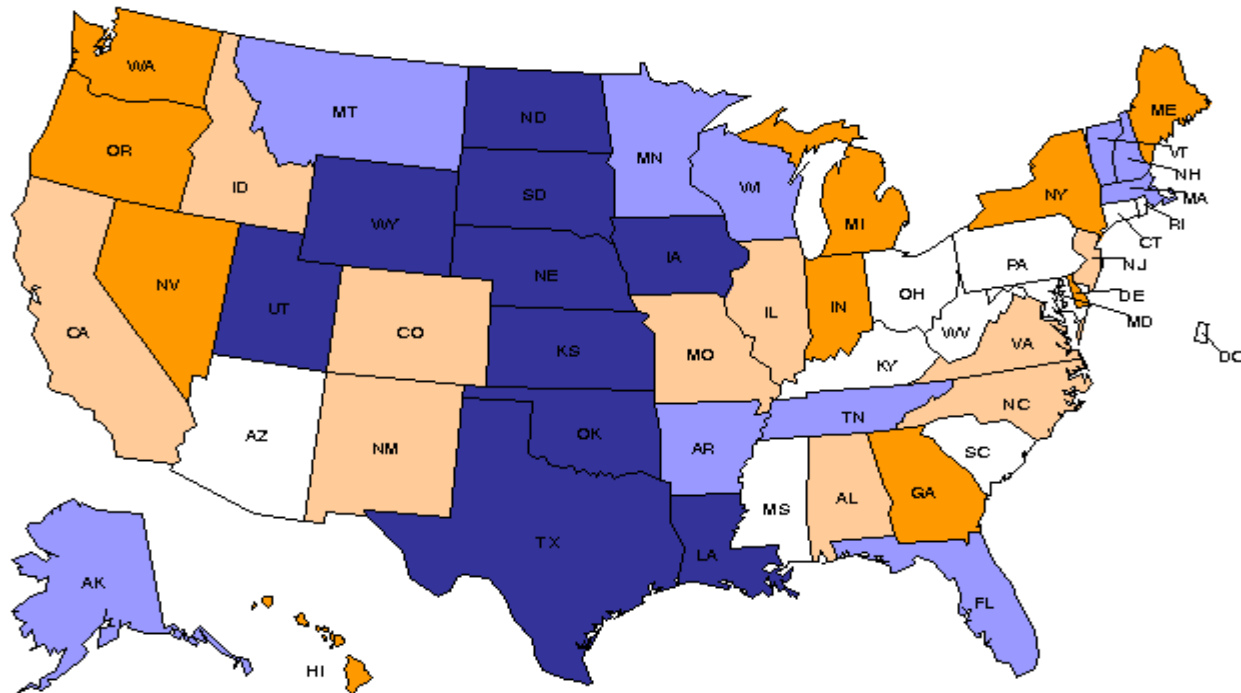

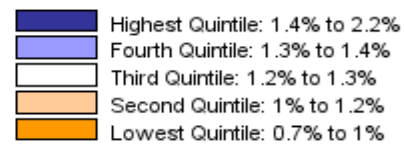
- Primary Source Data
 - Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW).
 - Current Employment Statistics (CES).
- Both Seasonally Adjusted using X-11 ARIMA model from US Census Bureau.

2011Q1 to 2011Q2 Percent Change



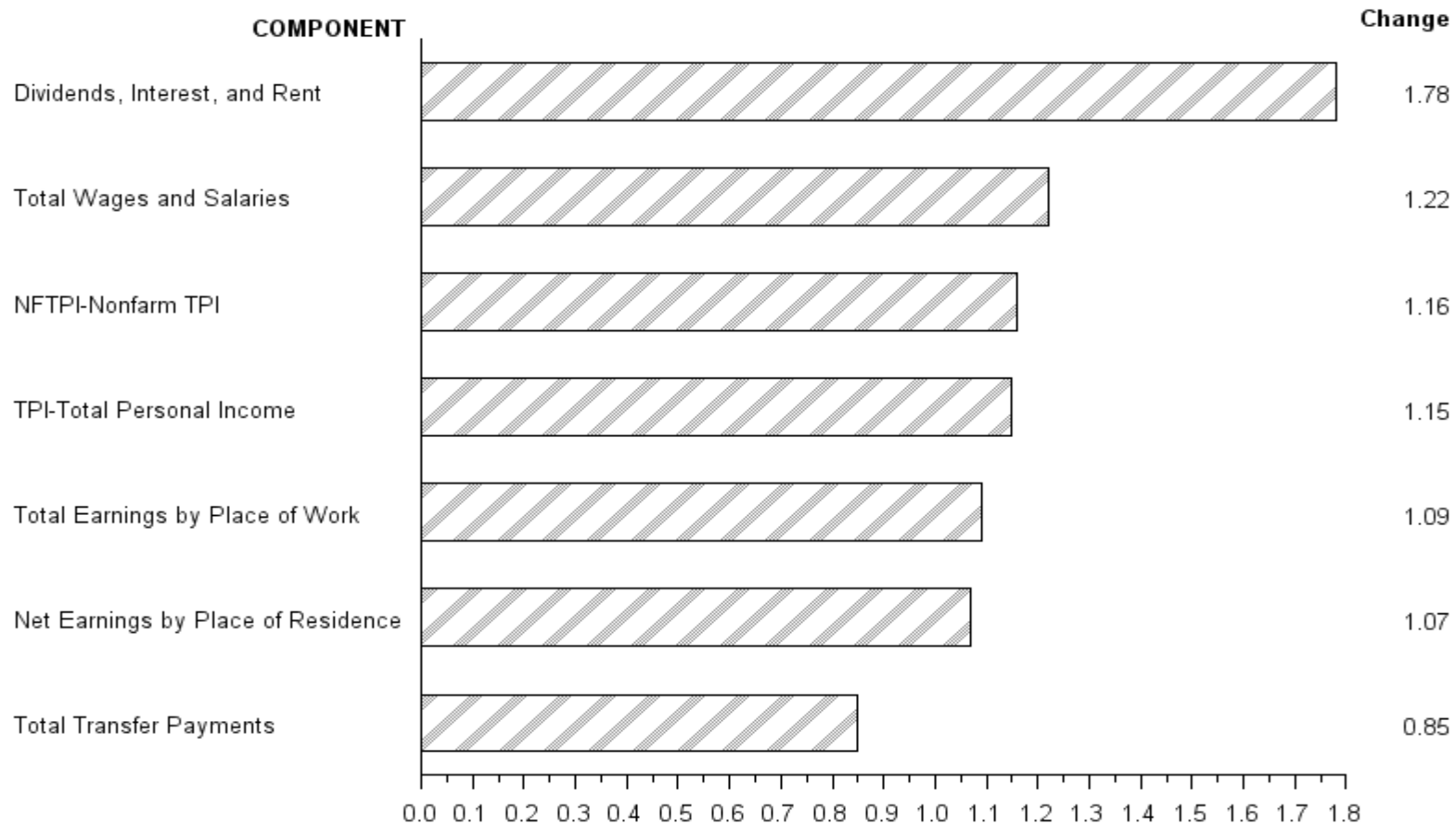
U.S. Percent Change = 1.2%

UNITED STATES 2011Q1 to 2011Q2 Percent Change

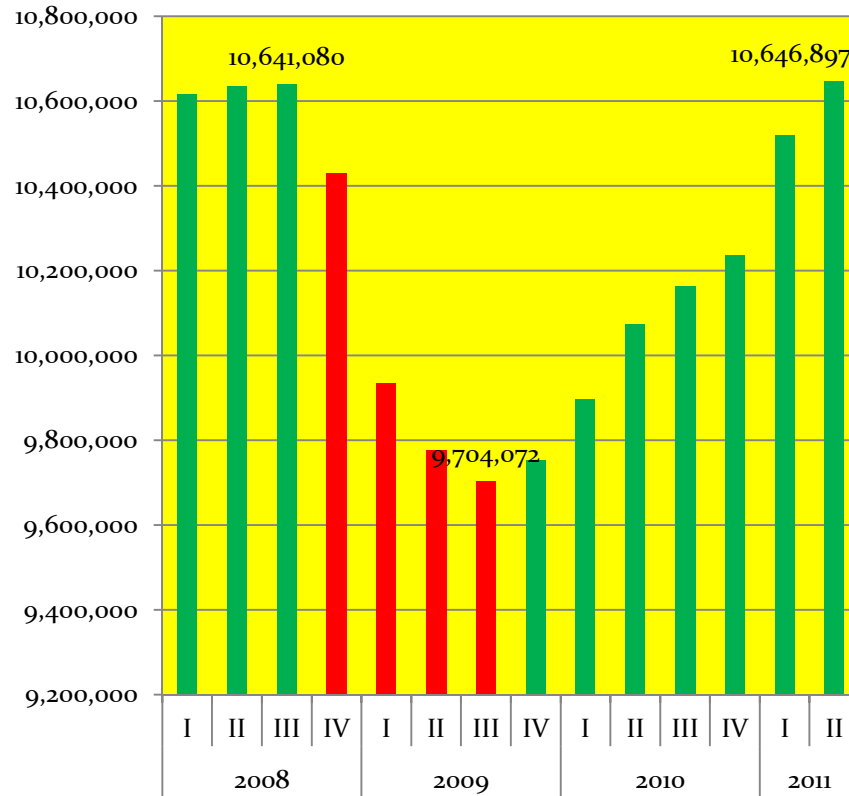

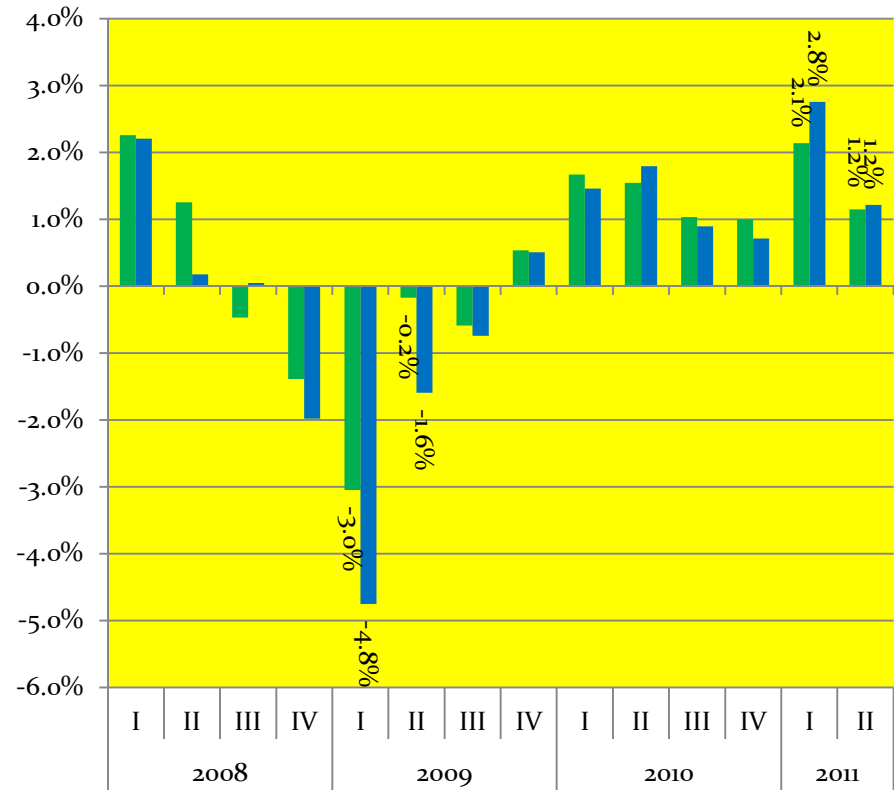

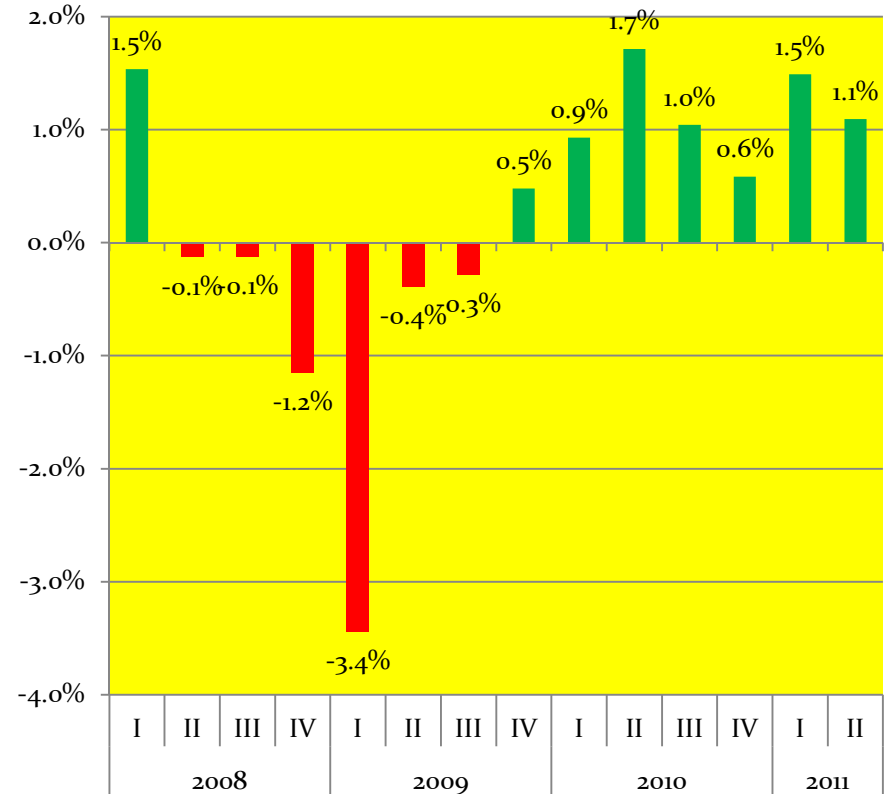

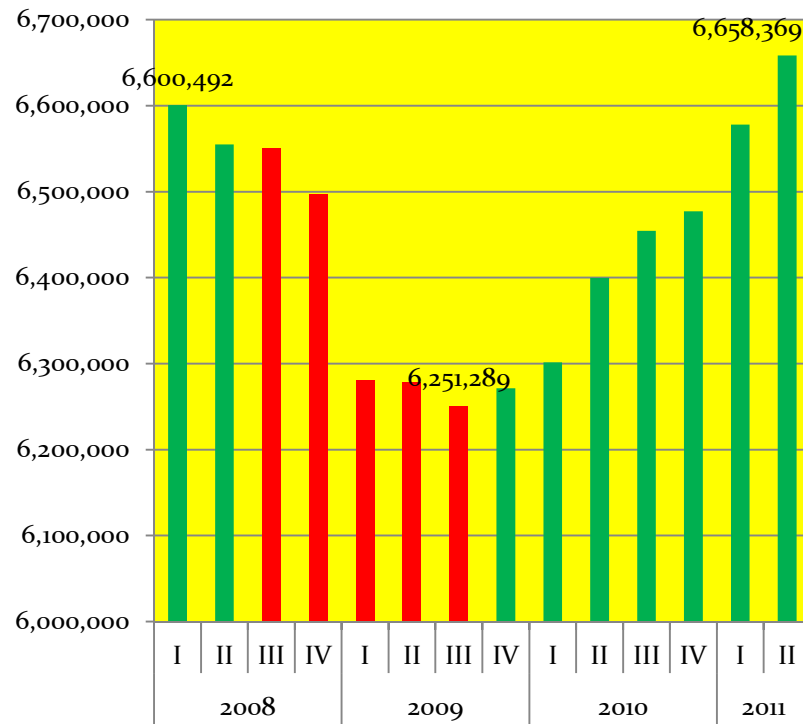
US Earnings by Place of Work

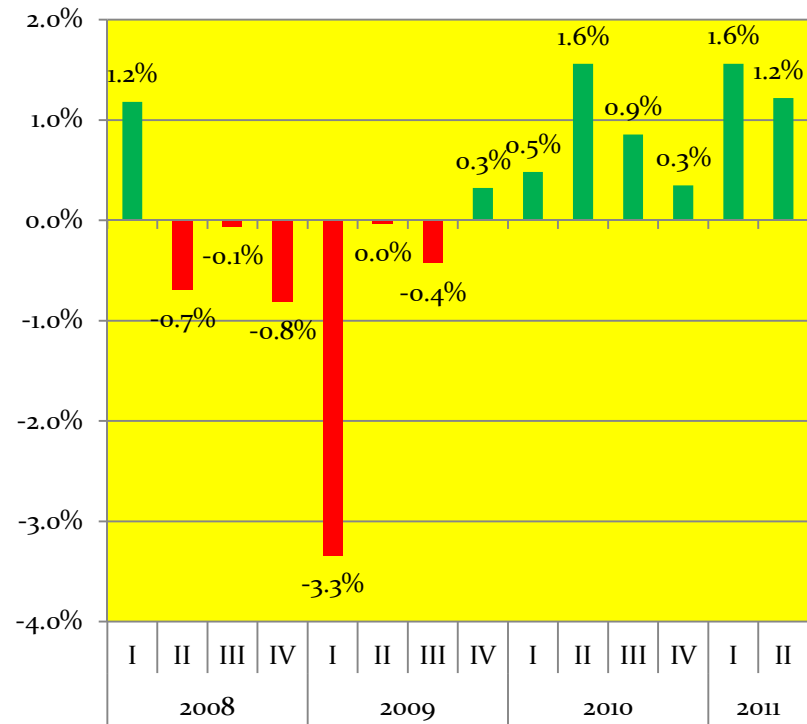

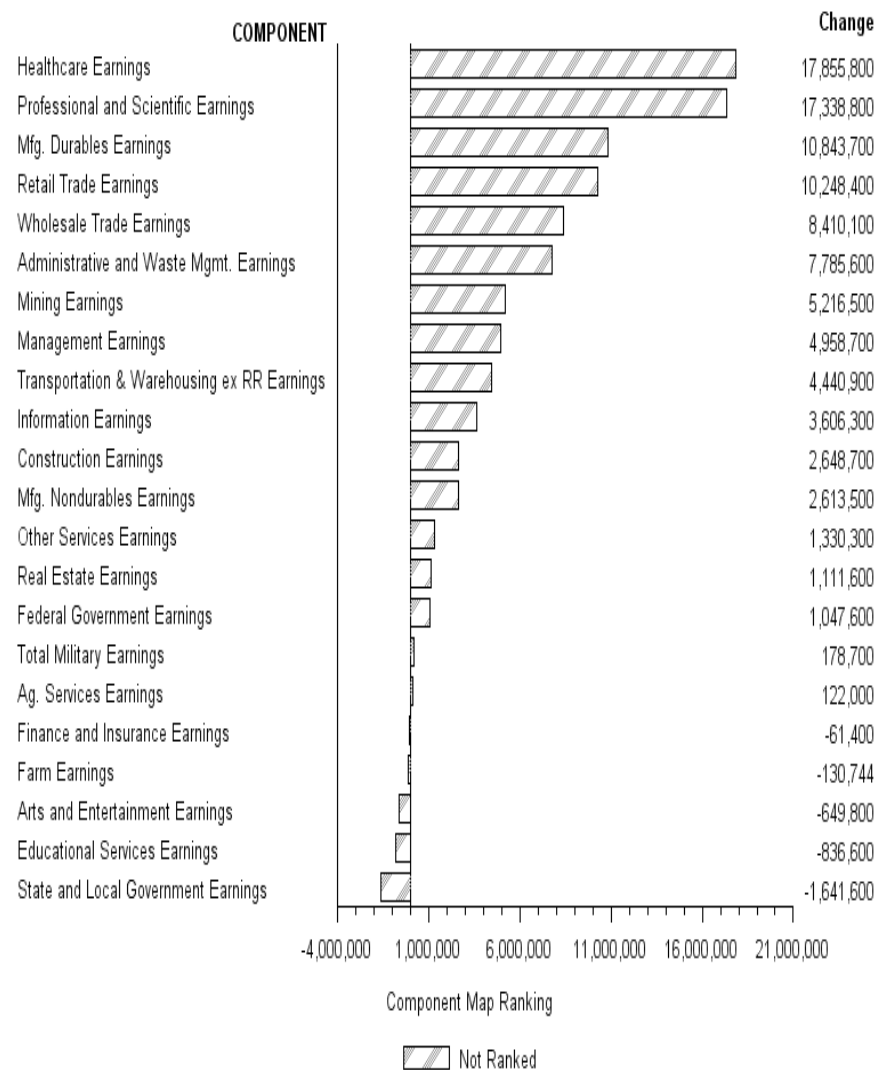
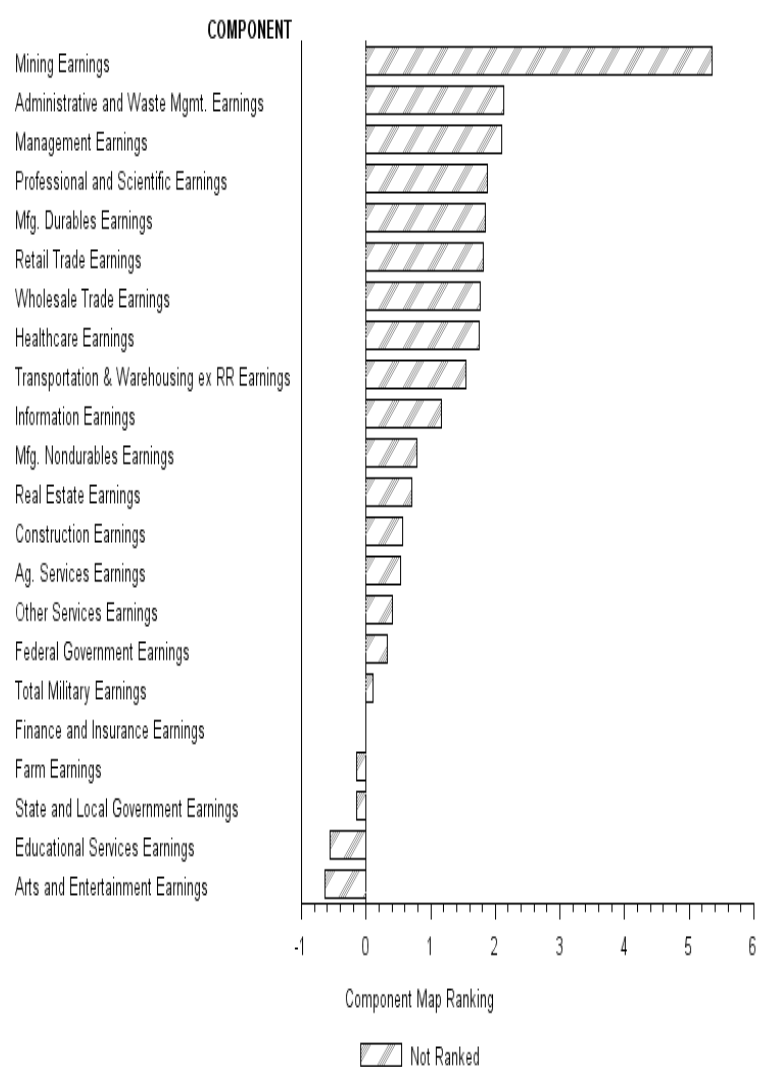
US Wages and Salaries

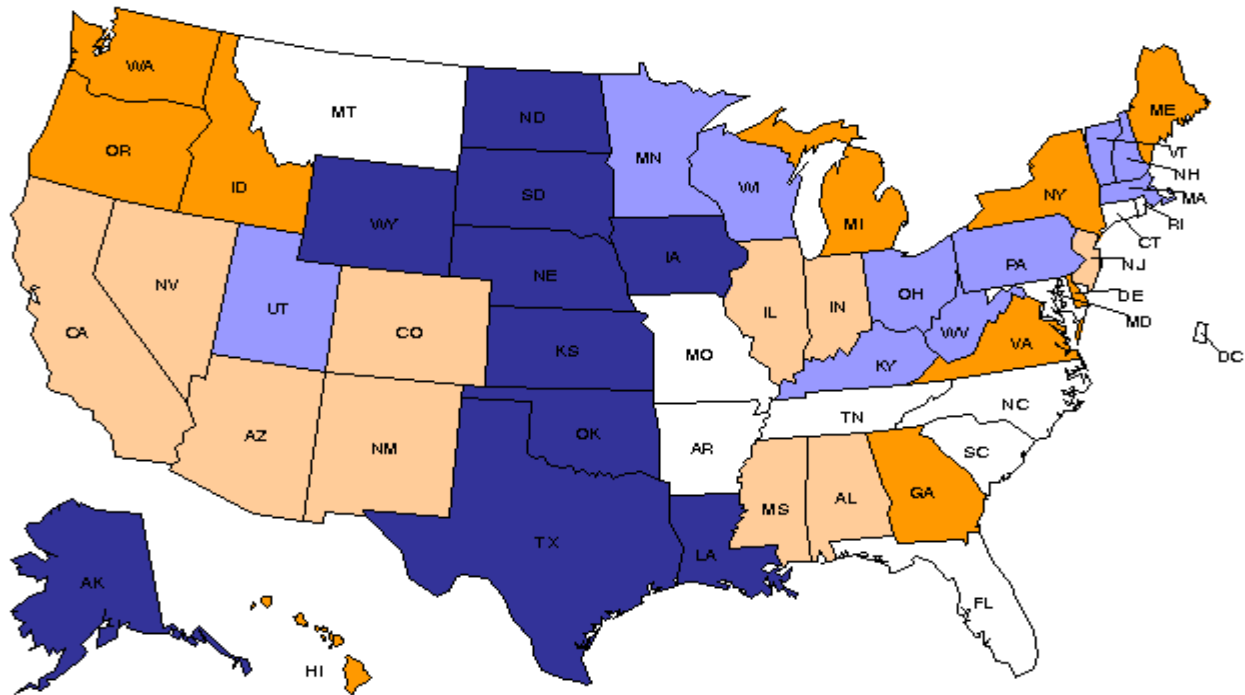
U.S Earnings by Industry 2011 Q2

2011Q1 to 2011Q2 Percent Change



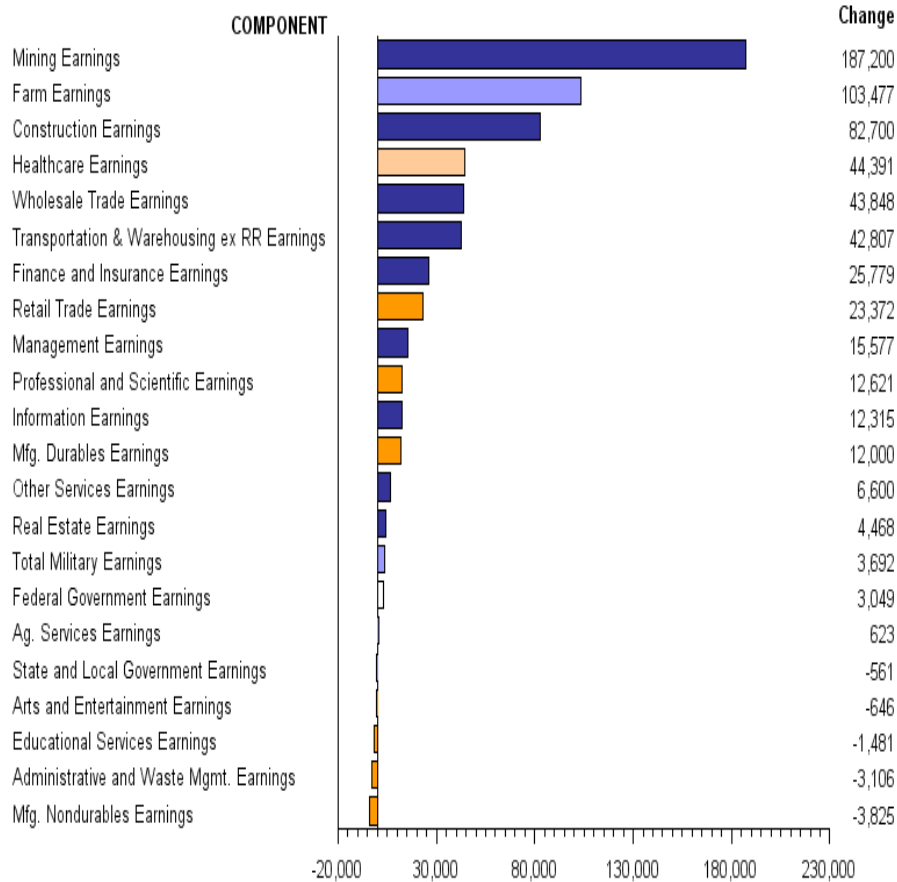
U.S. Percent Change = 1.1%

- Lowest Quintile: 0.3% to 0.8%

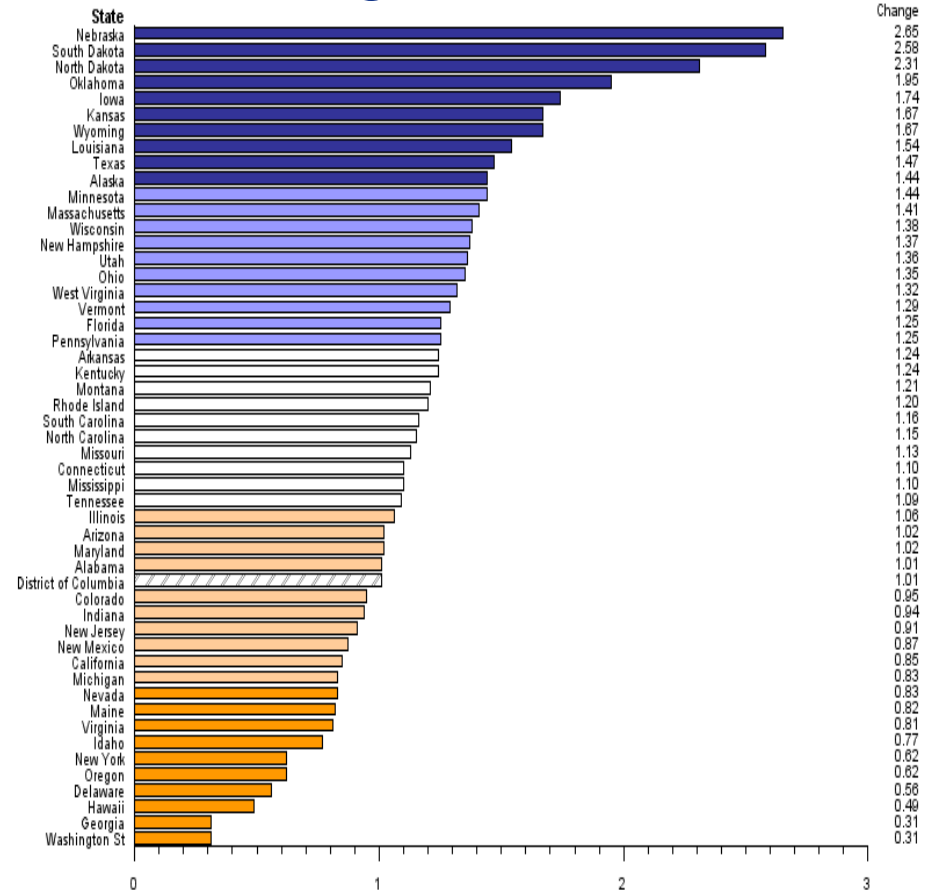

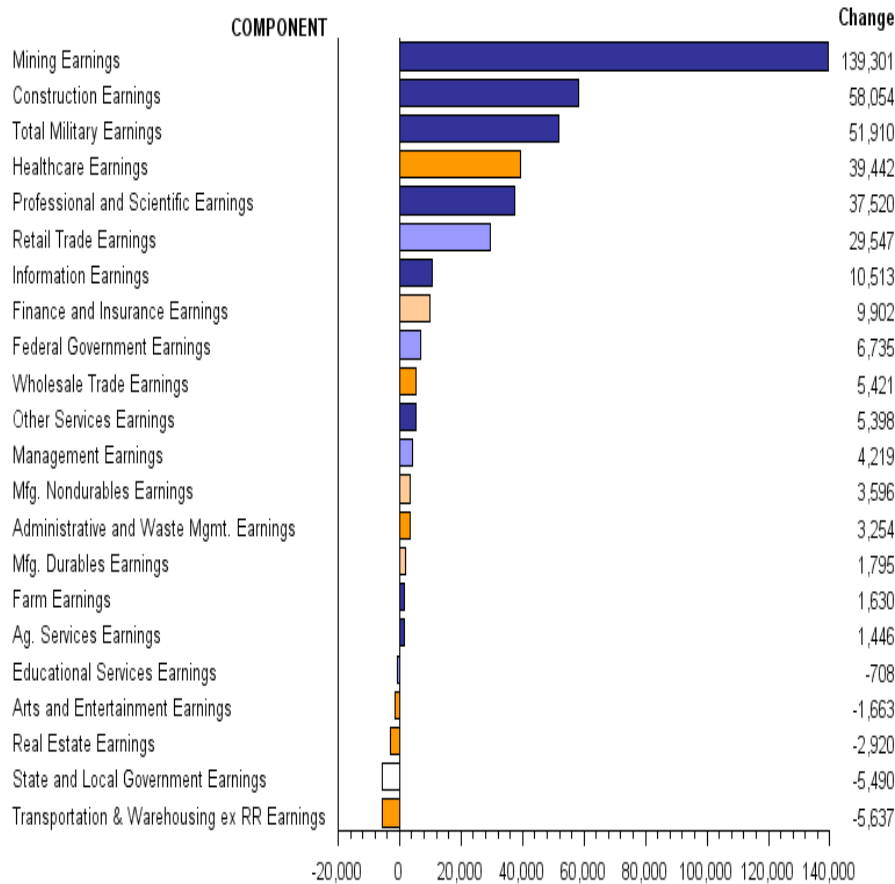
Net Earnings (All States)



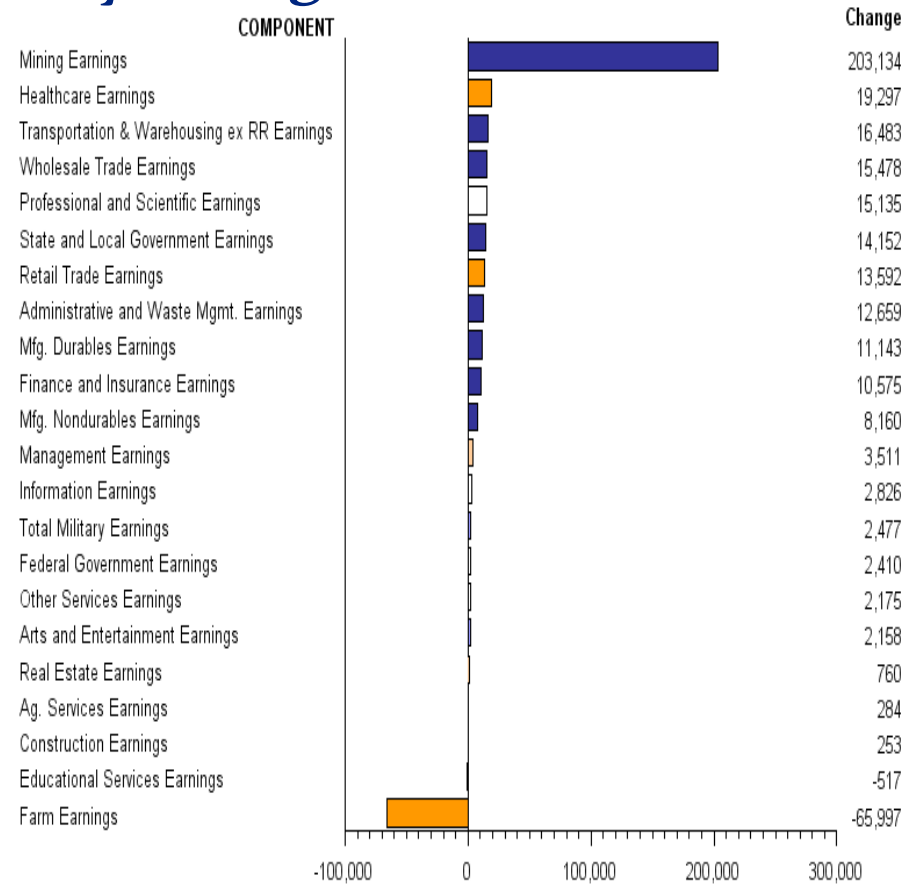
